

**CORPORATION STATEMENT**

Frontier School Corporation will be implementing the necessary health and safety measures to prevent the spread of COVID-19. Administration and local health authorities will constantly evaluate the presence of COVID-19 in the school community and our ability to maintain a safe environment within our schools.

**SCHEDULES**

**First Student Day - Thursday, August 5th**  
School starts on-time, in person, 5 days a week

**Jr/Sr High School: 8:15 - 3:15**

- Doors open at 7:30 for students
- No unsupervised students are allowed in the building prior to 7:55.
- Students shuttling from the Elementary to the Jr/Sr HS need to be at the Elementary by 7:50 to catch the bus.
- Bus locations & Exit doors will be assigned.
- Students that do not have after-school activities must leave promptly at dismissal.
- Extra-Curricular hours and arrangements will be communicated by the AD and coaches.

**Elementary: 8:10- 2:55**

- Buses unload at 7:50\* - students go straight to classrooms or breakfast
  - Breakfast in the cafeteria 7:50-8:10
  - Car rider arrival 8:00-8:10
  - Bus dismissal 2:55
  - Car rider pick-up starts at 3:00. Car rider number required for pick up.
- \* No students are allowed in the building prior to 7:50.
- K, 1st, 3rd - enter/exit through playground door
  - 2nd, 4th - enter/exit through main entrance
  - 5th & 6th - enter/exit through the gym entrance
- Entrances may be altered in bad weather.

**Field trips and special events will be evaluated based on COVID-19 mitigation efforts**

- Parent/Teacher conferences will be virtual or in-person by appointment on Sept. 14, 2021. Students will NOT have Distance Learning on parent/teacher conference day.

**MITIGATION PROCEDURES**

**Goal: Stop the spread of COVID-19 and prevent school closure**

- A confirmed positive COVID-19 case could result in areas of Frontier Elementary and Frontier Jr.-Sr. High School being unavailable due to cleaning. Distance Learning will occur so as to not lose instructional time.
- Long Term Closing would occur if there are multiple positive cases in the corporation and/or in the community. White County Health Department would work with Frontier School Corporation to make that decision. Distance Learning would occur during the closure period.

**COVID TESTING-** If anyone in your household is symptomatic and being tested for Covid, your student and all siblings within the household will need to quarantine, while waiting for the result of the Covid test.

If the person being tested ends up being negative, the non symptomatic students may return to school if they do not have any symptoms **and** provide the negative COVID result of the person who was tested in the household. If your student's result is negative, the student may return to school within 24-48 hours of being symptom free with a copy of their negative result.

If a student tests POSITIVE for Covid-19, the school will follow the Indiana of Health guidelines for when the student can return to school.

**Vaccinated Staff & Students:** If a person is fully vaccinated (14 days after the second dose), they may not be quarantined as long as they don't have symptoms. If they are deemed as a close contact, and don't have symptoms,

**COVID SCREENING** must be conducted at home every morning before sending a student to school. If symptoms are shown, contact the attendance line. The school nurse will contact the family to determine next steps.

- \*Fever of 100 (F) or greater
- \*Cough/Runny nose

<p>they will be required to wear a mask at school and extracurricular activities for the 14 day quarantine period. If symptoms develop, then quarantine guidelines would be followed.</p> <p><b>QUARANTINED STUDENTS</b> are expected to keep up with their classwork in real-time. There will be some lag time because the student isn't physically at school, but students are expected to communicate with their teachers and keep up with all classroom work as close to normal as possible. A quarantined student cannot "do nothing" while at home and then come back to school expecting to make up all their work. If your quarantined student is sick, and cannot complete the required work, then a parent should contact the school so that we can code the student as being sick. <p>For <b>unvaccinated students and staff</b> face coverings are recommended but not required; however, vaccinated persons do not have to wear face coverings.</p> <p>If a COVID-19 outbreak occurs within the school year the policy of optional <b>FACE COVERING</b> may be amended and changed.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>*Had close contact (within six feet of an infected person for at least 15 minutes) with a person with confirmed COVID-19</li> <li>*Traveled to or lived in an area where the local, tribal, territorial, or State Health Department is reporting large numbers of COVID-19 cases as described in the Community Mitigation Framework</li> <li>*Lives in an area of high community transmission as described in the Community Mitigation Framework while the school remains open.</li> </ul> <p>If a student is symptomatic or has tested positive for COVID-19, the student will be isolated at home for 14 calendar days or can opt into a 10 calendar day quarantine (Jr.-Sr. High School students only have the option of the 10 calendar day quarantine. Mrs. Wheeldon will send parents the specific criteria.) but must wear a face covering and have additional mitigation for days 11-14. Students must be 72 hours fever/symptom free (without use of medication) before returning to school.</p> <p><i>The parent/student must consult with the school nurse before re-entry.</i></p>
<p><b>BUSES</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Seating Charts will be required on buses to assist with contact tracing efforts</li> <li>● Siblings will be seated together on the bus</li> <li>● Face masks are required for the bus.</li> </ul>	<p><b>For all illnesses, students must be fever-free and symptom-free for 24-48 hours without the use of fever-reducing medications. Frontier School Corporation reserves the right to request a Doctor's statement before a student is allowed to return to school. Parents can refer to the illness portion of the student handbook for more information.</b></p>
<p><b>FOOD/CAFETERIA</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Snacks must be pre-packaged (if allowed in the classroom)</li> <li>● No sharing of food, in classrooms or in the cafeteria</li> <li>● Adjustments to cafeteria serving lines and seating</li> </ul>	
<p><b>SOCIAL DISTANCING - Jr-Sr High School</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Classroom seating charts / rows, 3 feet separation.</li> <li>● Larger classes will be relocated to larger room locations.</li> <li>● Keep moving during transitions</li> <li>● For contact tracing, cafeteria seating will be assigned and movement regulated.</li> <li>● Music classes will exercise additional mitigation.</li> </ul>	<p><b>SOCIAL DISTANCING - Elementary</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Alternating lunch/recess schedules with time for cleaning between grade levels</li> <li>● Designated building enter/exit per grade levels</li> <li>● Seating charts; 3 feet socially distanced</li> <li>● Scheduled bathroom breaks</li> <li>● Preschool students will enter/exit from the preschool doors, not through the main entrance.</li> </ul>
<p><b>Unvaccinated visitors are asked to wear a mask when visiting school buildings.</b> Including, but not limited to: volunteers, mentors, lunch guests</p>	

**HEALTH AND HYGIENE**

- Students with symptoms will be assessed and evaluated by the school nurse and isolated or sent home if needed.

**Drinking Fountains**

- Drinking fountains in certain areas will be available and will be cleaned multiple times each day
- Touchless water bottle fillers will be available
- Water bottles - disposable or take home daily for cleaning/washing
- Water is available with school lunch

**Professional Development** will be provided to all staff and students at the start of the school year to inform them of COVID symptoms and screening measures.

COVID educational signage will be posted.

**CLEANING PROTOCOLS** will be increased daily and nightly. Hand sanitizer stations will increase within the building. Hand washing will be required throughout the day.
